
County Fair Nitrate Water Testing

February Study Focus Review

Understanding Adverse Childhood Experiences

Thank you to Stacy Ledvina from Manitowoc County Human Services for sharing her experiences with Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACE's). Nineteen members braved the weather to hear our speaker.

Ms. Ledvina started with a You Tube presentation by Nadine Burke Harris. She is known for linking adverse childhood experiences with harmful effects to health later in life. Adverse Childhood Experiences are very common. These ACE's are experienced by children where parents may do substance abuse, parental separation or divorce, mental illness, battered mothers, or parents that have done criminal behavior. It can also include emotional or physical neglect along with emotional physical or sexual abuse. Each time a child is faced with one of these ACE's their whole body is affected. To some this happens on a regular basis. As the child becomes older, Ace-attributed problems can arise, such as liver disease, mental health problems, coronary heart disease, or alcoholism.

To help children overcome some of these issues, *Kids at Hope* has been started. *Kids at Hope* is an initiative to use positive youth development to transform families, schools and communities. This initiative is being promoted in Manitowoc County. To learn more about *Kids at Hope* please go to www.kidsathope.org.

Scholarship Information

Memorial Leadership Scholarship

The Memorial Leadership Scholarship was established through a memorial from the Betty Hilbert estate and the monies from the WAHCE Legacy Fund. This scholarship (\$200) is to be used to encourage members of WAHCE to seek leadership training so they may become capable, willing and enthusiastic leaders in the organization. This scholarship is available to WAHCE members only for registration to a leadership program. (Members of the WAHCE State Board are not eligible.) The application is due June 30th to the State Scholarship Chair and may be used for leadership opportunities during the previous months from the last Scholarship, as well as to upcoming leadership opportunities.

Student Scholarship

The Manitowoc County Association for Home and Community Education will award two \$500 scholarships annually. Applicants may be seniors in high school or college students continuing their education. Applicants must be sons, daughters, or grandchildren of a current Manitowoc County Association for Home and Community Education member. This scholarship can be used for any field of advanced study. The deadline to apply is April 1st of the current year.


