This year approximately 205 county wells were tested. Last year 105 were screened for nitrates. We were very excited with the results. Thanks to the HCE members, who volunteered to assist the Manitowoc County Soil and

Spring Lights Up My Life

Amy Kohlmann called the HCE Spring Association Salad Supper to order at 5:30 PM. Peggy Neuser, East Center Chair, welcomed us and said a prayer before we ate. A delicious salad supper followed.

The HCE Meeting was called to order at 6:38 PM. by Amy Kohlmann. Peggy Neuser led us in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag and our HCE Creed. Linda Verlinden, Secretary, did the roll call of the clubs. We had 51 club members, 11 individual members, and 10 guests for a total of 72 people. There were no additions or corrections of the secretary's minutes as printed in the newsletter. Phyllis Hickmann, our treasurer, gave the financial report. There were no additions or corrections to her report. We voted to send the monies from our Pennies for Friendship for the clean water filters.

Nancy Oehldrich, our VP of Programming, gave her report. We had 19 people at the "Understanding ACE's" Study Focus in February. In March we had 23 members and 4 guests for "Keeping Your Credit Report in Check". In April there were 24 members who learned about "Taking a Picture on Mariner's Trail." She thanked us all for coming to the study focus groups. Nancy was thanked for getting all of the speakers.

Amy Kohlmann reported on Family & Community Life since Cindy Christianson could not attend. Amy introduced Lia Haile, a 9th grader, who started the Hopeful Hearts. She told us it all started when she met a blueeyed boy named "Joey. He and his mom were residents of Hope House and it was his birthday. His mom was unable to give him a party or buy presents. So Lia decided to go back and give him a birthday party and that's how Hopeful Hearts was started. That mom and boy became a family there and not just a "homeless family!" Amy asked for ideas for next year's project for Family and Community Life. Call Cindy Christianson or Amy Kohlmann with your ideas.

Amy Kohlmann reported that the FLE position is now called Interim-Health & Well Being Educator & HCE Advisor. Robert Burke, our Regional Director, said that there are no open position at this time for our county.

Committee Reports

Mary Ann Rabitz gave the scholarship report. This year 4 students applied. The committee chose two student applicants and one adult. The first scholarship winner was Kathleen Reis from Oregon, WI. She attends Oregon High School. She will attend Justin University to become an architect. Her grandmother, Mary Reiif, read her essay. The second scholarship winner was Kyra Rahmlow, from Mishicot High School. She read her essay. She wants to be a teacher and will attend UW- Stevens Point. Marge Hendrickson won the adult scholarship which she will use to attend the HCE State Conference here in Manitowoc. She thanked us and encouraged us to apply for the adult scholarship next year and also for the state level scholarships that are available at the state website.

It was brought to our attention that the scholarship committee was thinking of giving just one \$1,000 scholarship instead of two. Discussion followed. Points raised were we had four applicants this year instead of one, Kyra Rahmlow stated the application was easy to fill out. The HCE Board will decide this issue in September.

Shirley Oswald reminded us of our well water testing at the Manitowoc County Fair on August 21-26. She will pass around a sign-up calendar. People who volunteer do get in to the fair for free. We should wear HCE clothing or HCE pins to advertise our organization.

Nancy Oehldrich informed us that the international program will be on Saturday, October 5th at 1:00 PM. There will be a surprise speaker for that program.

Jan Siewert, newsletter committee, reported that if we are not receiving the HCE newsletter to please let her know. Items need to be submitted electronically or get to herself or Amy for assistance.

Linda Verlinden, Reading Buddies, gave her report. She read the list of 8 books read this year and showed art projects that were done. Reading Buddies read just once a month and spend about a half hour in the classroom reading and doing some kind of art, literacy or science project with the Head Start preschool children.
