10 Cup Cookies

1 cup softened butter
1 cup creamy peanut butter
1 cup sugar
1 cup packed brown sugar
2 eggs room temperature
1 cup flour

1 tsp baking soda

1/2 tsp baking powder

1 cup quick oats

1 cup coconut

1 cup pecans/walnut

1 cup raisins

1 cup chocolate chips

Mix peanut butter, butter and sugars until blended. Add eggs beaten in.

Whisk flour, baking soda, baking powder and then gradually add to mixture.

Stir in coconut, quick oats, nuts chocolate chips and raisins. Bake 350 degrees for 12-15 minutes. Cool on rack for 5 minutes.
